Proclamation

By The County Mayor

Whereas, the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a respiratory disease that can lead to serious illness or death, and

Whereas, on January 21, 2020, following the guidance of the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, the Tennessee Department of Health designated COVID-19 as a reportable disease in Tennessee; and

Whereas, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the COVID-19 outbreak a global pandemic, and

Whereas, on March 12, 2020, Tennessee Governor Bill Lee issued an Executive Order to facilitate the treatment and containment of COVID-19, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated 58-2-107(e)(l); and

Whereas, on March 13, 2020, President Trump declared a National State of Emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

Whereas, as of March 20, 2020, there have been one (1) confirmed case of COVID-19 in Hardin County; and

Whereas, COVID-19 is a danger to the health, welfare, and economic well-being of the citizens of Hardin County, Tennessee; and

Whereas, it is imperative that the County take all necessary measures to contain COVID-19 and prevent its spread throughout the county, and

Whereas, in the judgment of the undersigned, an emergency currently exists within Hardin County, Tennessee as defined in TCA 38-9-101(2) and 58-2-110; and

Whereas, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and its impact, a public health emergency does exist in Hardin County; and

Whereas, this Order shall be effective and enforceable at 12:01 a.m., Central Daylight Time, on March 23, 2020, and shall remain in effect until 12:01 a.m., Central Daylight Time, on April 6, 2020, at which time the suspension of any state laws and rules and the other provisions of this Order shall cease and be of no further force or effect.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT, I, Kevin Davis, County Mayor of Hardin County, by virtue of the power vested in me by Title 58, Chapter 2, hereby declare a State of Emergency exists as it relates to the COVID-19 pandemic and do, hereby, invoke the authority granted by Tennessee law and any other applicable laws for the duration of this emergency.

I, KEVIN DAVIS, FURTHER DECLARE AND ORDER THE FOLLOWING:

1. Hardin County, it's departments and agencies, are authorized to seek any and all necessary federal and state funding
2. All required procedures and regulations as to procurements on behalf of the county are hereby suspended for the purchase of equipment, materials, supplies, and services needed for emergency management purposes to combat this threat
3. The Hardin County Emergency Management Agency is hereby authorized to exercise all powers and authority granted to it by law
4. The County Mayor of Hardin County shall use all the resources available to the Office to protect the health and welfare of the people of Hardin County
5. It is understood that the term "gatherings" in Executive Order XXXX as used in Section XX does not apply to blood drives conducted by the American Red Cross and other blood collection organizations provided social distancing practices are implemented to the maximum extent practical in the administration of such drives. The collection of blood is an essential service.
6. Until April 6, 2020, restaurants should provide take-out and/or delivery service only. Bars and gyms should close until April 6, 2020, further notice. Additional closures and changes may be required depending on results of further medical testing for this virus.
7. This Declaration and Order shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance, the public welfare requiring it.
